#### K/PP/1/2 News!

We are always busy little bees in the K-2 class!

On Monday the K/PP children were exploring the 'k' sound. We practiced a new skill of sewing to make kangaroo pouches. It was lots of fun but some of us found sewing really difficult! We hope we did a good job, otherwise our kangaroo joeys might fall out!!



The K/PP children also made a kite on Monday. It was really tricky to tie the knots on our string! Monday was a fantastic day to fly a kite!!! Danama's even flew over the fence!!! The Kindy children completed a kite colour by number picture. We are trying really hard to look at the first sound in words to gain meaning.





The K/PP children made kiwi fruit kebabs. We had to use a knife to cut the ends off the kiwi fruit and trim off the skin. We then had to cut the kiwi into small pieces so we could thread it onto a kebab stick. The Pre-Primary children wrote about the procedure they followed. We are getting very clever!



The Year 1 and 2 children spent the morning exploring the "oo" as in 'book' sound which can also be made with "u" as in 'bush.' Each Monday they read a given text and complete related comprehension questions. Their writing task this week was writing a report on strawberries. In Science we are exploring changes in food and are learning about how heating or cooling a food can change its properties and whether the change can be reversed or not. This week we looked at the difference between raw spaghetti and cooked spaghetti and used comparison language. We then made a picture with cooked spaghetti which is much easier to work with than raw spaghetti. Kye made a building that was flooded. Mardi made a house. Romeo made a love thing for his Mum. Nelliah made a beach picture. Charlotte-Jane made a beach picture.
